Report warns of loss of sea fish stocks

HALIFAX, Nova Scotia - Fish stocks throughout the world could face near extinction by 2050 if more isn't done to stem the increasing strain on all species, especially those in deep waters, says a report released Friday.

The article, published in *Science* magazine, says authorities must try to contain a trend that has trawlers venturing further offshore and destroying habitats as they search for large species.

The paper, titled the "Future for Fisheries," describes measures that should be taken to "bring fisheries back from the brink and reduce the danger of extinction for many species."

Boats have been moving into deeper water to find larger fish, such as tuna and groupers, as smaller species become fished out.
